Complete application no later than Friday, February 16, 2024.



COURSE SCHEDULE

- Classes will meet most weekdays from Monday, July 1st through Wednesday, July 31st at Libros Schmibros Lending Library, 103 N. Boyle Avenue, across from Mariachi Square in Boyle Heights.
- Students will be in class from about 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. most days. Hours will be longer on days with field trips.

During the Libros Fellowship, you will learn from readings, films, expert guest speakers, extensive field trips, and hands-on workshops in writing and designing the city.
